Greetings from Vietnam.

We are delighted to receive your donation of five thousand pounds sterling to help us to prevent

the Human Trafficking of young people from Vietnam.

As recent as September 2017 Ameila Gentleman reported in the Guardian Newspaper that "Hidden in woodland, on the site of an old coal mine, the well-organised camp known as [Vietnam](https://www.theguardian.com/law/2017/sep/10/vietnam-city-french-holding-camp-uk-migrants) City is usually home to between 40 and 100 Vietnamese migrants, some of them minors, who are on their way to the UK to work illegally in cannabis farms, nail bars and restaurants" (<https://www.theguardian.com/law/2017/sep/10/vietnam-city-french-holding-camp-uk-migrants>)

We can confirm that this fund will be used for the purposes you describe as

"to enable people to gain employment or make a living and support their families (education, books, equipment and training)"

In fact our interventions with the families of struggling fishing villages at Muine is directed at preventing the kind of migration and trafficking of young people described in the Guardian Article above.

Your generous donation will enable our village liaison team to access and to assess the most high risk families that need free scholarships on our Anti Trafficking Intervention programmes.

It will enable us to offer language classes in English three times a week, Skill training in restaurant and bar work, and tour guide skills training as their language ability increases. We place our students with higher training level resorts and bars in Muine and support them into employment.

We will be happy to furnish an end of project report for you with an evaluation of its merits and challenges.
